## A Patient's Story

D.H. is a female patient in her late forties. She has severe retinopathy and has been out of work for ten years due to her ill health. She has known Michele Smith, Diabetes Educator and Health Link Care Coordinator, for thirteen years through the Diabetes Education Clinic. Given this past clinical relationship, D.H. feels she has a "good comfortability level" with Michele.

Given this history and knowing that D.H. matched the Health Links profile, Michele reached out to D.H. to engage her in the Health Links approach. D.H. was very interested, as she was struggling to cope with her failing eyesight. Her Health Link goals included dealing with her depression and social isolation by linking her to a counsellor and helping her find some meaningful volunteer work. During her time as a Health Link patient, D.H.'s family doctor shut down their clinical practice, and so Michele also helped D.H. secure a new doctor.

In speaking with D.H, she said Health Links made a difference and that she is so glad that Michele reached out. She was in a difficult position and it "touched her heart" to have Michele support her working through her issues. Health Links is "more personable, more personal". Michele "knows me...I was frustrated with my diabetes which I can't control..." The Health Link approach wasn't to "stick me with more needles, but to get me out of the house. To get me back to being 'ME'..."

I want to thank you for everything that you have done. I saw Dr. XXXX today. What an amazing man! He is already trying to put me into programs with other disabled people and what have. You will never know how much I appreciate what you have done Michele.

## **Implementing the Health Link Approach**

At its essence, Health Links can be simple. It is linking a patient to existing services to help them reach the goals they set, rather than serving them based on the diagnoses they may receive.

However, implementing the Heath Link approach can be difficult. Identifying and successfully engaging a patient can be a challenge for a front line clinician who is accustomed to a more diagnosis-based approach. Navigation is more than just knowing to whom one can refer; one must also be aware of the rules of various health care and other government programs and how they intersect with and sometimes contradict each other. Care coordinators must *convince health care providers to work differently* within the same structures and with the same resources.
