Pembroke Regional Hospital Will Not Be Allowing Visitors Or Essential Caregivers On 3rd Medical Unit Due To COVID-19 Cases

PEMBROKE – The Pembroke Regional Hospital will not be allowing visitors or essential caregivers / care partners for patients on its 3rd Medical unit until further notice after four patients have tested positive for COVID-19.

As a result, the hospital is putting in place additional safety measures, including these restrictions in order to reduce further transmission.

The only exception will be circumstances, such as end-of-life where visitors may be approved on a case-by-case basis if fully vaccinated, and able to wear all appropriate PPE.

In addition, the Pembroke Regional Hospital is currently implementing enhanced testing and containment strategies to prevent further transmission among staff and patients.

"This outbreak is an important reminder that we all need to continue to do our part to reduce the spread of COVID-19," said PRH President and CEO Pierre Noel.

PRH continues to encourage all residents to do their part in order to help reduce the spread of the virus including:

- Getting vaccinated with all the doses you are eligible for.
- Limiting close contacts.
- Wearing a mask in indoor public spaces.
- Staying home if you are sick.
