Emergency Preparedness

- This month's Code exercise will feature Code Amber. An exercise involving a scenario on our Obstetrics unit will take place on Thursday, November 20th at 11 a.m. As always, all staff are expected to understand their role in PRH emergency codes and participate if they are working the day of the drill. Those who aren't involved should take time to review the related policies and procedures.
- While it's not imminent, we will be partnering with the City of Pembroke and other agencies for a city-wide Emergency Preparedness exercise that will be taking place in April, 2026 with a scenario that involves mass casualties and an internal Mock Code Orange. This will be a great opportunity to see how everyone works together in the face of a potential disaster and see what improvements can be made.

Project Horizon

• At today's Management meeting, it was shared that the build of our new Epic platform is about half-way complete which is exciting news!

Some of the next steps towards implementation and go-live include:

- A large scale validation exercise to determine if the information from our current Anzer platform will transfer to Epic properly
 - Continued work on the readiness of our existing systems to integrate with Epic
- Planning for the recruitment of approximately 70 Super Users who will be instrumental in the golive period

This will be one of the communication tools that we use for increased communications in the lead up to our go-live date of October 24th, 2026! In Case You Missed It - Highlights From Sabine's Messages

Proposed Amalgamation with The Phoenix Centre for Children and Families

First, an update on our progress with the Phoenix Centre amalgamation proposal. After months of work, I am pleased to share that we submitted our proposal to Minister of Health, Sylvia Jones on October 30th. The Ministry now has 150 days to review the documents, ask questions and request more information.

We believe that our proposal was well written and answered all of the questions that the MOH had for us. Our stakeholder engagement process



was extensive and did not expose any concerns or risks and we were able to attach several letters of support to the proposal including one from our MPP. I'm hopeful that the next update will be good news for both of our organizations!

PRH Welcomed Ontario Health's Chief Regional Officer

On October 29th, our Senior Leadership Team welcomed Scott Ovenden, Ontario Health's Chief Regional Officer for Toronto and East regions. This was his first visit to PRH and we took the opportunity to tour him around and provide a comprehensive overview of the great programs and services we provide as well as where some of our challenges lie. He had great things to say about the things that he saw and all of the friendly faces we encountered along the way. Thank you to all of you for making his visit with us a great one!

Grand Opening of Our Chemotherapy and Medical Daycare Space

The evening of October 29th was a time for celebration as we officially opened the newly renovated and expanded Chemotherapy and Medical Daycare space on the 1st floor of Tower D. This ceremony marked the completion of Phase 2 for our Cancer Care Project and was attended by approximately 60 guests including donors, staff, physicians, municipal leaders, Board members and community partners.

It was a wonderful opportunity to showcase this space which has been thoughtfully designed and completely transformed to better serve our patients and their families during some of the most vulnerable moments in their lives.

This new open-concept treatment area allows for more interaction between patients, fostering a sense of community and support while also affording dignity, comfort, and connection.

I want to take a moment to sincerely thank our incredible staff who work in this unit. Their feedback, their insights, and their compassion were instrumental in shaping this space. From choosing the paint colours to selecting the therapy chairs, their voices were heard — and the result is a space that truly reflects the care and empathy that they bring to work every day.

Local resident Michael Blackmore who is one of our chemotherapy patients also praised the staff in some emotional remarks.

He shared how beneficial it is to be able to receive treatment close to home and praised the collaboration between his Ottawa-based oncologists and the health care professionals here at PRH.

As an RN for the past 35 years and a health care leader in the long term care sector, he noted that he knows first-hand what quality care looks like before giving a shoutout to the staff. He shared how, from the moment a patient arrives, they are greeted with "kindness and welcome familiarity that grows with each appointment" and are treated with "compassion, expertise and empathy" which makes the cancer care journey feel more manageable and less isolating.

His remarks were moving and validated that the work our team is doing for local cancer patients is top-notch.

Construction Updates

It's been a few weeks since I have provided a status update on some of our remaining construction projects so I wanted to let you know where we are at with those this week.

Unfortunately, our Tower C Main Entrance Project has experienced a three-week delay involving the application of fire retardant in the ceiling for the Auxiliary's relocated Gift Shop and there have been

some other delays related to the availability of sub-contractors. As a result, we are now looking at a completion date sometime in February.

In other construction news, you may not be aware that the Pembroke Family Medicine Teaching Unit (PFMTU) is undergoing some renovations on the 4th floor of Tower D involving their patient exam rooms.

While this work is progressing well, there will soon be some plumbing work for the installation of new lines for their washroom sinks and toilets which will require ceiling access on the third floor where our OR Recovery Area is located. To minimize disruptions, this work is scheduled to take place starting the afternoon of Friday, November 14th through Sunday, November 16th. The work will be performed behind an infection control wall barrier under negative pressure however the three rooms in the back will be inaccessible throughout that weekend.

Budget

Lastly, you will have heard in the news that the province tabled its 2025 Fall Economic Statement last week. While it didn't include word of any additional funding for hospitals, the Ontario Hospital Association did release a statement reiterating the significant financial pressures facing the hospital sector and the need for multi-year planning scenarios in order to help hospitals prepare for the future.

There does seem to be some healthcare infrastructure spending allocations in the federal budget which is positive, but I think it's too early to know what that will mean in the end and how our hospital will benefit.

One thing that is good news, is that there have been funding increases announced for Ontario Health at Home. I'm actually in Toronto today at a meeting where Ontario Health at Home's Anna Greenberg talked to CEOs of medium size hospitals about her vision for home care and the government's newly announced 1.1 billion dollar investment.


She emphasized the need to improve how we collect and use data to measure performance. She also highlighted the importance of reviewing key projects - especially those that help patients transition from hospital to home -to guide future planning and investment.

The long-term goal is to build strong, connected care teams that include hospitals, community support services, and other partners. Early conversations have started between Ontario Health at Home and the primary care action team to figure out how to create a more coordinated care system. So good news, but lots more to come.








Manager or Delegate - Host a Guided Discussion:

Delirium Prevention - Many medications can contribute to confusion and disorientation in hospitalized patients.







sedatives can cause dizziness, confusion, balance and coordination difficulties, slurred speech and increased risk for falls. Administration of sedatives may reduce the symptoms and inadvertently prevent searching for or treating the cause.

Sedatives may increase risk for a respiratory event (e.g. reduced dose in older adults, hypoventilation due to obesity, obstructive sleep apnea, etc).

Sedatives may have additive and unintended sedative effects if given in proximity to other agents that may cause disorientation or dizziness, increasing patient risk (polypharmacy)

What alternatives to sedatives could you use for a patient who is at risk for delirium or who has active delirium?



Manager or Delegate - Host a Guided Discussion:

Q: How does polypharmacy contribute to delirium, agitation and confusion and what can we do about it?

A: Administer medications carefully. Work collaboratively with the physician and pharmacist to identify high-risk medications for older adults and consider de-prescribing (use Beers Criteria list - Lexicomp/UpToDate). Observe for potential side effects of medications.







The Beers Criteria List identifies medications that are "potentially inappropriate" - avoid or use with caution in those 65 or older. Take extra care prior to prescribing, make sure that safer alternatives have been considered and confirm that the likely benefits outweigh the risks



Nurses can help advocate for patients by recognizing higher risk medications that are prescribed for their patient, limiting administration of PRN medications that may be harmful, and advocating for potential de-prescribing.



4 Common medication types that may affect brain function in those over age 65:

- Anticholinergics or meds with anticholinergic effects
- o these meds reduce PNS ability to 'rest' and 'digest'
- · Benzodiazepines & non-benzodiazepine sedatives
- Antipsychotics
- · Opioids

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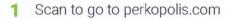
