Subject: Transition of Complex Continuing Care (CCC) Beds to Onsite Location – April 1, 2026

We are excited to share an important update regarding our care delivery model at Pembroke Regional Hospital (PRH). After many years of operating our Complex Continuing Care (CCC) beds at Marianhill, these beds will be transitioning to our acute care hospital site by April 1, 2026.

- Optimize resources to better meet patient needs

FAQ – Transition of CCC Beds

1. Why are we moving CCC beds on site?

This change supports Marianhill as they open their new Long-Term Care (LTC) beds and ensures CCC patients continue to receive high-quality care within our hospital setting.

2. When will the transition happen?

The official move is scheduled to occur by April 1, 2026.

3. Where will these beds be located in the hospital?

The beds will be co-located with medical beds (some to be moved down from 3B) on 2A medical unit.

4. Who is managing this transition?

A dedicated transition team is overseeing all planning and implementation steps to ensure a smooth process.

5. Will this affect my current role or responsibilities?

While no immediate changes are expected, some role enhancements may occur as we support CCC patients onsite. Any changes will be communicated well in advance.
