Spring may not be in the air, but change is certainly in the air provincially. It is interesting that the language around the proposed changes to the healthcare system echo the basic values of the Health Links work that we are engaged in.

Minister of Health Christine Elliott announced on February 26, 2019 that the government's plan:

"... would improve access to services and patient experience by: [o]rganizing health care providers to

work as one coordinated team, focused on patients and specific local needs. Patients would experience easy transitions from one health provider to another (for example, between hospitals and home care providers, with one patient story, one patient record and one care plan)."

Sound familiar? In Western Champlain, our aim has always been to promote and provide this experience for our Health Link patients.

#### **Thank You**

Thank you to the fifteen agencies providing roughly fifty staff to work as lead care coordinators as part of their daily jobs. With those dispersed care coordinators and six full time Health Link Care Coordinators, Western Champlain Health Link exceeded its fiscal target. By March 31, we anticipate over 480 Coordinated Care Plans (CCPs) completed as well as over five hundred active Health Link patients in our area.
